 Peer Editing

1. Share a "rough draft" of your research paper with one member of your community. Your draft should be typed and include MLA style citations. Be sure that your paper is complete enough that your community member can make a fair assessment of your research, writing style and consideration of the topic.

While reading your community member's paper:

- Correct spelling and grammatical errors
- Make suggestions for paragraph organization and breaks (when they're too long)
- Note places where citations are needed
- Note places where more information is needed or would be beneficial
- Suggest areas and ideas to expand upon
- Identify where the writer has described a work in detail and has used an art historical methodology to analyze a work – if missing, make suggestions for where these sections could be added

As a last resort, you may also take your rough draft to the Writing Center and have a tutor assess your draft. Please have the Writing Center tutor provide proof of your session and attach it to this cover sheet.

2. Your instructor will use the rubric below to grade your research paper. Using the same rubric, grade your partner's paper. You are not being asked to be mean, but are encouraged to provide as much critical and constructive criticism of your partner's paper as possible!

Share your rubric with the writer of the paper before submitting.
